David's Abstract: lowans were the first to face vast expanses of grasslands and the prospect of settling there without wood for fuel. Several, including an enterprising group of Linn County Quakers turned to peat for the answer in the middle of the 19th century. The enterprise created both scoundrels and heros, fortunes were won and lost, and the lessons learned had national implications.

The club is paying expenses for John McArdle, Minneapolis, to come a day early for our March show and teach two MSHA-certified safety classes on March 15, the Thursday before our show. Choose either a 2:00 or 6:00 class. Each class lasts 2 hours, ends with a test required for certification, and costs **\$20 per person for those new to the course; \$10 for those who are re**-

newing and have the book (must bring certificate and book to class). John says if you pay attention in class, you will be able to pass the test easily.

As quarries tighten admittance for rock hounds, MSHA (Mine Safety & Health Administration) safety training has enabled some people to access quarries that would not otherwise have let them in. We may require the training for some of our field trips in the future, or some of the quarries may require it. Certification is good for 1 year. We are encouraging members to get the certification.


